Senior Resource Services had also made the switch to using an online calendar system which will now allow all of our staff members to view the transportation request schedule from their computers. Please be patient with us as we make these updates, and enjoy the new look!

Process Reminders

Senior Clients— If you need to make several stops during your requested trip, please let the office know that when you schedule your request. This way the volunteer will reserve the amount of time needed to provide the transportation. As Senior Resource Services continues to grow at an amazing rate, it is very beneficial to the Volunteer Coordinators if the Seniors can give us 5 days notice before the needed day of transportation to match them with a volunteer.

Volunteers—If you are transporting Seniors, please call your client a day or two before the scheduled time. This allows you an opportunity to introduce yourself, tell the client what color vehicle you are driving and arrange what time the Senior needs to be picked up. Usually when the office takes the client's request we take the appointment time and the volunteer and client can arrange the pick up time.

It's Tax Time-Need Help?

Taxpayers who earn less than \$49,000 can get help preparing and e-filing their taxes for free at Aims Community College through Tax Help Colorado, a program funded by a grant from the Denver-based Piton Foundation. Aims has helped more than 2,000 Weld County tax payers claim more than \$3 million in federal and state refunds in the past three years through the program. Students from Aims and the University of Northern Colorado, as well as community volunteers, will be helping with tax preparation this year. "Tax Help Colorado has been a tremendous success and is an extremely rewarding experience," said Aims Accounting Instructor Gina Jones.

Interested parties should bring the following documents: All W-2, 1099 and other incomerelated documents, proof of mortgage interest, property taxes, daycare payments, college education expenses, charitable contributions and all other tax-deductible expenses, Social Security cards for all family members, a copy of last year's tax return, if available bank account number and routing number to direct deposit refunds (direct deposit refunds will be received in 7 to 10 days)
